

5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: SHAKE IT OFF, DUDE



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: Jesus said that we will be persecuted if we live for him, but Jesus also says that our faithfulness will be rewarded in Heaven. Acts 5:17-42, Disciples Rejoice in Persecution



M HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Talk to your kids about how it feels when other people make fun of them. How would they feel if someone mocked them for believing in Jesus? How could you remind yourself that being persecuted is a blessing?



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Why were the apostles put on trial?
- What did the apostles do after they were set free?
- Why is it a blessing to be persecuted for our faith?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Ephesians 4:32 (NIV)
